Prof. Hector Tsang

Professor Hector Tsang is the Cally Kwong Mei Wan Professor in Psychosocial Health, Chair Professor and Head of Department of Rehabilitation Sciences of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. He has had rich experience in the leading role for the development and quality assurance of educational programmes for physiotherapy and occupational therapy from undergraduate to doctoral levels. He has been honorary professor at the University of Hong Kong and visiting professor of many prestigious universities, including Peking University and Shanghai Jiao Tong University. His research interests include integrative medicine, psychosocial rehabilitation, and assistive technology. Also, he serves as member in the Steering Committee for Primary Health Care and the main consultant in a number of commissioned studies in rehabilitation by the HKSAR Government.



Prof. Shamay Ng

Prof. Shamay Ng currently serves as the Associate Head of Department of Rehabilitation Sciences of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. She had worked as a physiotherapist in different clinical settings both locally and overseas before joining The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Her research interest is neurological rehabilitation. She has received teaching awards at the Departmental and Faculty level.



Prof. Amy Fu

Prof. Amy Fu is involving in teaching, research and consultation in the area of musculoskeletal and sports. Prof. Fu's research foci are on early detection, assessment and rehabilitation of musculotendinous problems so as to optimize function and sports performance. She is the Associate Head of the Department overseeing infrastructure and the MSc Scheme as well as the Clinic Director of the Rehabilitation Service Centre (Physiotherapy) of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University.



Dr. Shirley Ngai

Dr. Shirley Ngai is an Associate Professor of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Her teaching specialty is Cardiopulmonary Physiotherapy. Shirley is the principal applicant and co-applicant for more than USD\$1.12 million of teaching and learning grants to develop teaching innovation to address students' learning needs. She is the recipient of several prestigious teaching awards such as 2016 UGC Teaching Award (Early Career Faculty Member) and Second Prize of 2018 National Teaching Achievement Award (Higher Education) by MOE of China.
